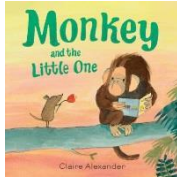

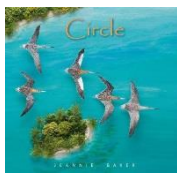

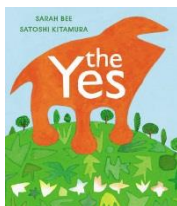
A disabled lad watches the migration of the Godwit in Australia as they leave for the arctic, imagining how it would feel to fly on this remarkable journey.

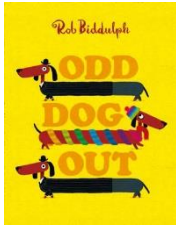

P

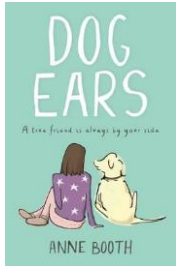
One for building self confidence. The Yes is determined to get to its destination but the Nos want to stop it. Good for determination and resilience.

Y

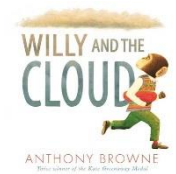
A dog that dares to be different and is proud to stand out from the crowd. Although initially she feels out of place the other dogs miss her and welcome her back and follow her lead.

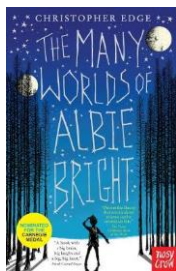
A story about feeling positive and how much nicer the world is when you do.

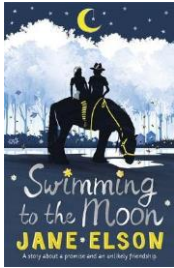
Sydney's mum has achondroplasia. This is a story about moving house and school as well as growing up.

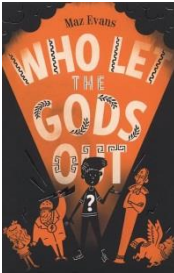

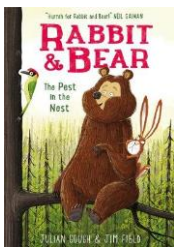
Friendship and cooperation are at the core of this book as Bee accepts the challenge of a sponsored swim although she can't swim to fulfil the promise she made to her grandmother.

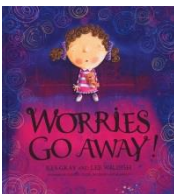
What happens when the culture of the Greek gods collides with modern Britain? Can Elliot and Virgo collaborate to solve each of their problems in this funny story?

Y

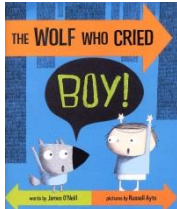
The Bobs are very different but they learn to accommodate these differences and become friends and then Blossom moves in and she likes playing with trucks.

CF

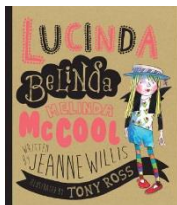

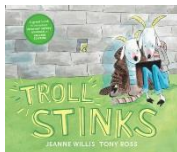
Told from the alternative perspectives of wolf and boy they are always raising a false alarm but a chance encounter brings both communities together.

P

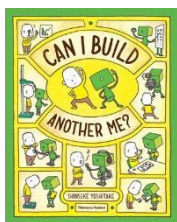
A humorous morality tale about the value of appearances. Sadly not all monsters are good and not all stories have happy endings.

A story to open discussions about what makes us all unique.

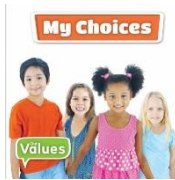


Hoffman, Mary – The Great Big Book of Feelings

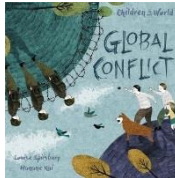


Jones, Grace – My Choices (Our Values)

It is important to make the right choice because our decisions can affect others. This provides a good vehicle for discussion.

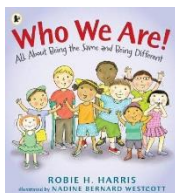

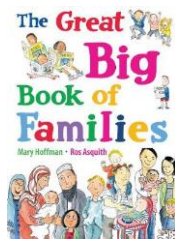

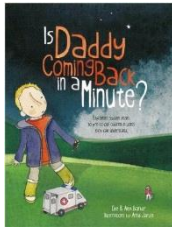
A simple and engaging introduction to the Human Rights Act.

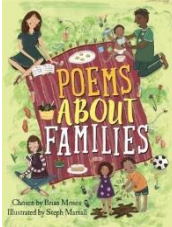
The story is about a girl making friends with her new neighbour who has a different faith. Includes teacher notes for discussing the theme. Part of the British Values series.

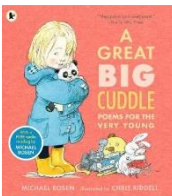
Daddy's heart has stopped and he has died. His young son learns to come to terms with this loss through the help of his family and the wider community.
