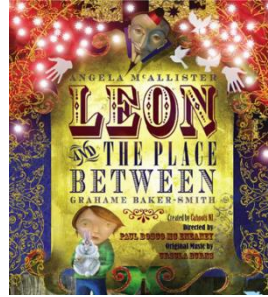

Adverbs

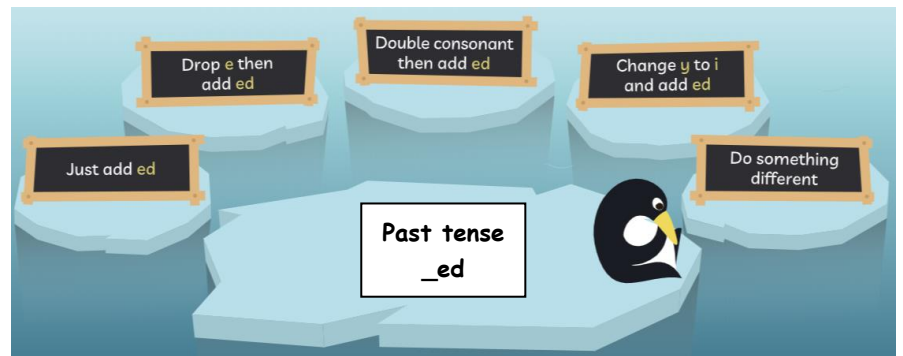
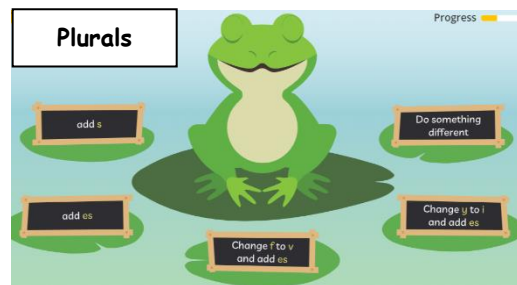
adverbs describe verbs

Suffixes

A suffix is a letter or a group of letters added to the end of a root word. The root word makes sense on it's own before the suffix is added.

_ing	climb ing
_s	rides
_es	box es
_ly	quiet ly
_est	fast est
_ment	excite ment
_ful	hope ful
less	speech less



Apostrophes of contraction

A contraction is a shortened form of a word (or group of words) that omits certain letters or sounds. In a contraction, an apostrophe represents missing letters.

it is = it's	do not = don't
he is = he's	she is = she's
cannot = can't	I will = I'll

Coordinating conjunctions are joining words that link together parts of a sentence. They can be used to join words, phrases or clauses.
